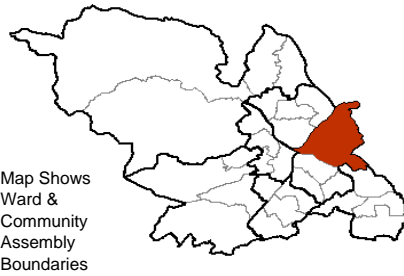


# Sheffield Health Profile 2011 for Darnall Ward

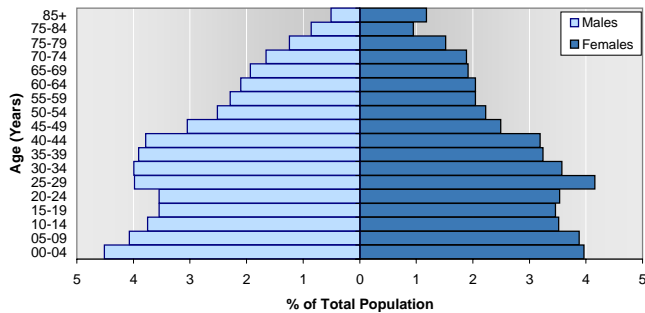
## Darnall Ward Some Key Observations in relation to the Sheffield average

### Key observations for Darnall Ward

- Ward with second highest proportion of under 5 year olds and under 20 year olds. 70% of school children are of non-White British ethnicity (the second highest rate of any ward). One of the most deprived wards in the city.
- 72% covered by a Healthy Community Programme Area
- Significantly high rates of crime, and low rates of Key Stage 4 educational achievement (age 15). Significantly high mortality rates and low life expectancy. Significantly high A&E attendance rates, and emergency admission rates.
- Significantly low rates of admissions due to alcohol related conditions, low rates of newly diagnosed sexually transmitted diseases, low rate of mothers recorded as smokers at the time of delivery, and low teenage conception rate.
- Significantly high rates of overweight/obese children aged 10 to 11.
- Ward with the highest rate of emergency admissions due to Coronary Heart Disease. Significantly high hospital admission rates due to chronic disease, stroke, diabetes, asthma and Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease. Significantly high mortality rates due to circulatory disorders.

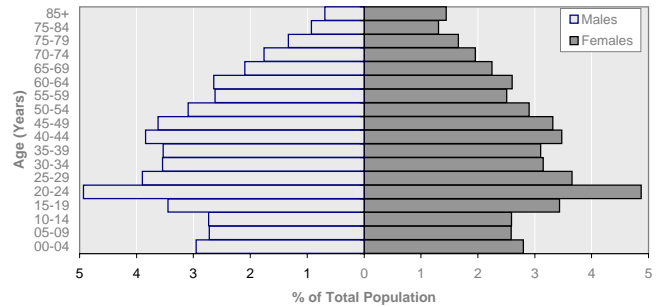

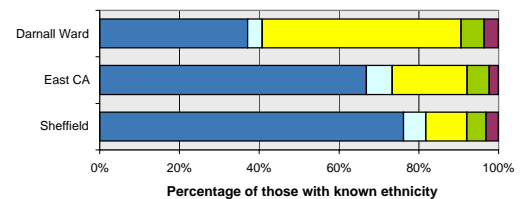

### Distribution of School Population (5-16 yrs) by Ethnicity, 2010/11

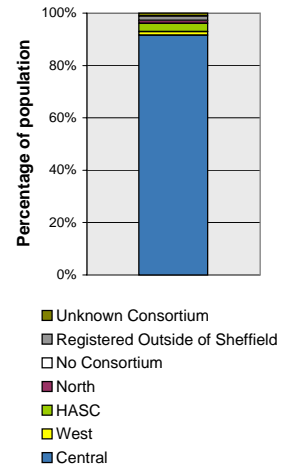

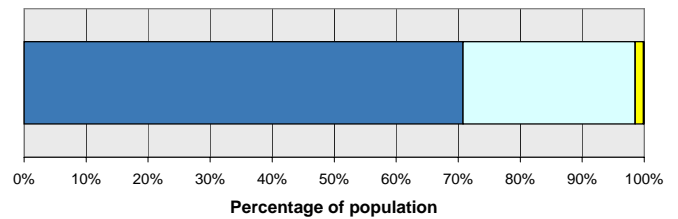

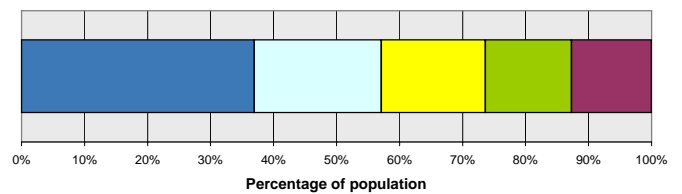

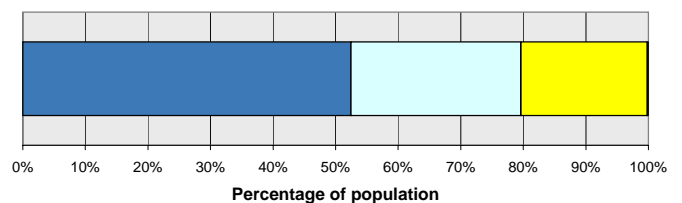
Proportion of Ward Population Resident in each Childrens Centre as at April 2011

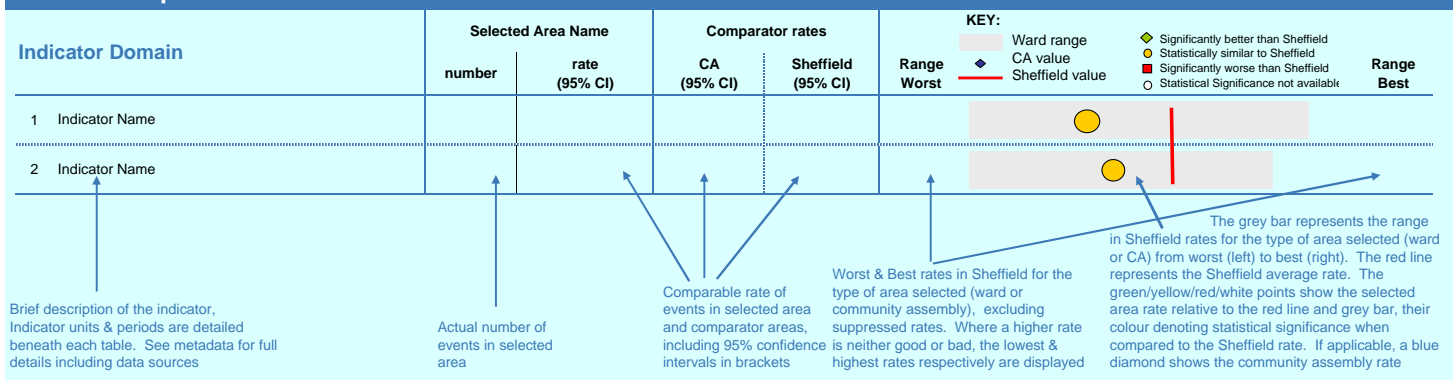
