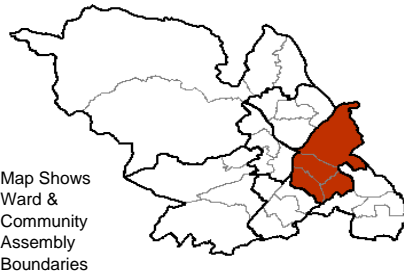


Sheffield Health Profile 2011 for East Community Assembly

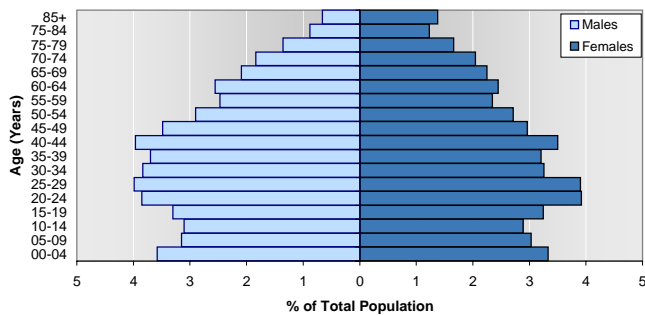
East Community Assembly Some Key Observations in relation to the Sheffield average

Key observations for East Community Assembly

- Wards comprising the CA: Arbourthorne, Darnall, Manor Castle, and Richmond. Note within the CA there will be variation of achievement levels between these wards.
- High proportion of children age under 14 years. 67% of the population covered by a Healthy Community Programme Area. The second most deprived CA in the city. High levels of crime.
- CA with the lowest level of Key stage 4 educational achievement (age 15yrs). Low levels of Y11 (age 15/16) staying in learning. Lower than average life expectancy, and high premature mortality rates (under 75 years).
- High A&E attendance rate and CA with the highest emergency admission rate. High hospital admission rate related to alcohol.
- CA with the highest premature mortality rate (under 75 years) due to cancer. High premature mortality rates due to circulatory disorders, coronary heart disease and respiratory illnesses.
- CA with the highest hospital admissions rate for cancers, Coronary Heart Disease, and Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease. High hospital admission rates for diabetes and asthma. High referral rate to mental health hospital inpatient specialities.

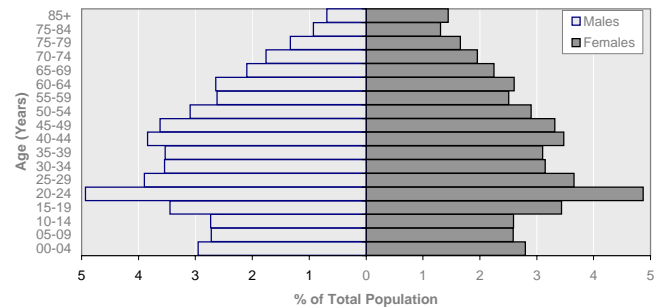

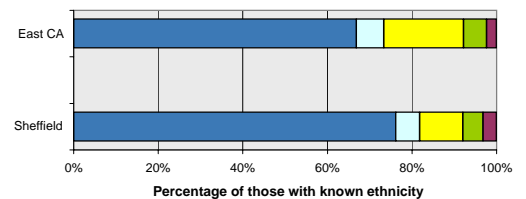

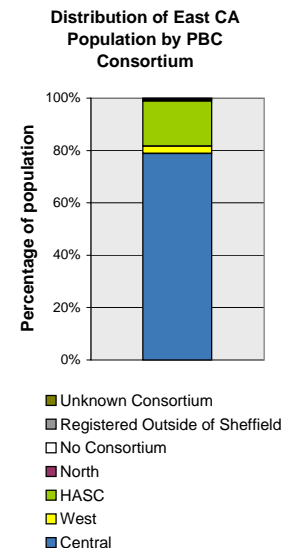
Distribution of School Population (5-16 yrs) by Ethnicity, 2010/11

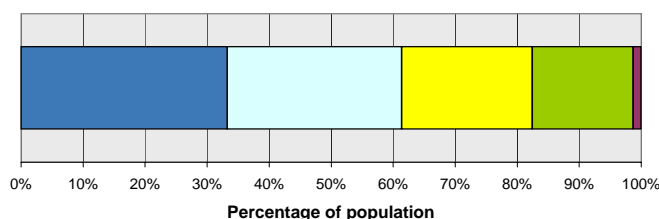
Proportion of CA Population Resident in each Healthy Community Programme Area as at April 2011

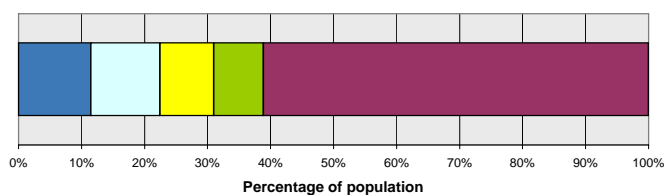
Proportion of CA Population Resident in each Neighbourhood as at April 2011

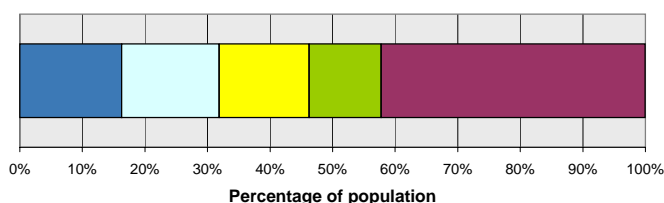

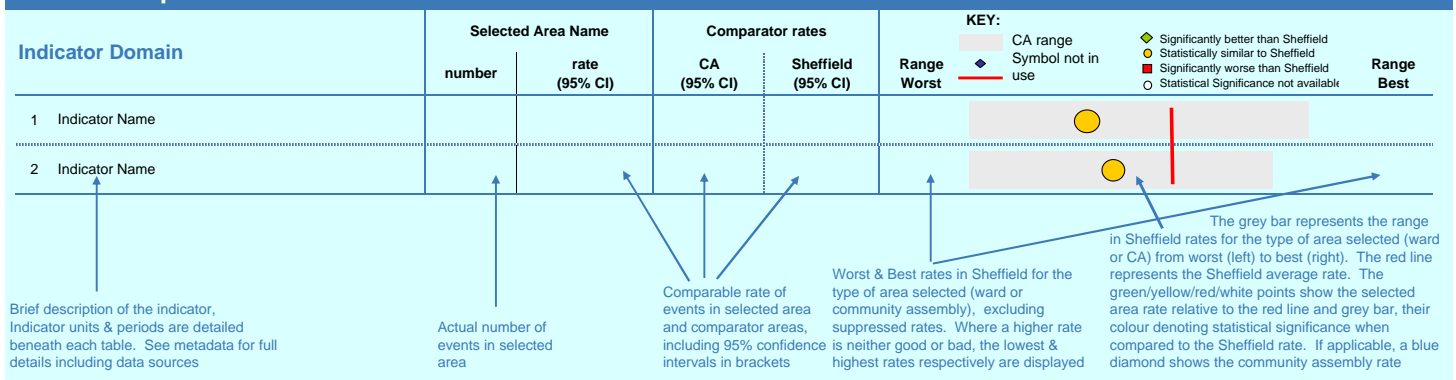
